Governor Richardson Lowers Flags in Honor of Air Force Staff Sergeant Christopher Frost

SANTA FE – Governor Bill Richardson ordered flags to fly at half-staff in honor of United States Air Force Staff Sergeant Christopher Frost, 24, who lost his life serving his country in Iraq on Monday, March 3, 2008.

“Staff Sergeant Frost served his country with honor and dignity,” Governor Richardson said. “My condolences go out to his family, friends and the Kirtland Air Force Base community.”

Staff Sgt. Christopher Frost was assigned to the 377th Air Base Wing at Kirtland Air Force. He is Kirtland AFB’s first Operation Iraqi Freedom casualty.

Staff Sgt. Frost grew up in Waukesha, Wisconsin and enlisted in the Air Force after graduating from Mukwonago High.

He is survived by his wife, Ashley; his daughter, MacKenzie; his son, Mitchel; his stepdaughter, Trinity; his parents, Garry and Bridget Frost; and grandparents, Marjorie Strabel, Mary Jean Frost and Galen Kurth.

In honor of Staff Sergeant Christopher Frost’s sacrifice, Governor Richardson signed an Executive Order directing that flags be flown at half-staff from Monday, March 17, 2008 to sundown on Tuesday, March 18, 2008.
