HOUSE EXECUTIVE MESSAGE NO. 25

Honorable Speaker Egolf and Members of the House:

Pursuant to my authority under Article IV, Section 22 of the New Mexico Constitution, I have vetoed HOUSE BILL 167, as amended ("HB 167"), enacted by the Fifty-Fourth Legislature, First Session, 2019.

HB 167 requires the periodic replacement of vehicle registration plates every eight years and imposes a fee of two dollars for each year of registration. Notably, under current law, a person with an illegible license plate is already required to obtain a duplicate or replacement registration plate. With that current law in mind, I do not believe that any marginal benefits that would be achieved through mandatory registration plate replacement are worth the additional financial burden that would be borne by New Mexicans. I am also sensitive to the fact that the additional fees would fall hardest on the poorest New Mexicans and make it more difficult for them to afford a legally registered vehicle. For these reasons, I have vetoed HB 167.
