EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-065

ORDERING FLAGS TO HALF-STAFF IN MEMORIAL OF JUSTICE RUTH BADER GINSBURG

Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg was a vanguard in the fight for gender equality and a champion for civil liberties. As an advocate, Justice Ginsburg successfully argued several of the most significant gender rights cases before the United States Supreme Court. During her tenure as a member of the Court, Justice Ginsburg continued to serve as a champion for civil liberties. She authored the seminal case of <u>United States v. Virginia</u>, 518 U.S. 515 (1996) and her dissent in <u>Ledbetter v. Goodyear</u>, 550 U.S. 618 (2007) led to the passage of the Lily Ledbetter Fair Pay Act. Justice Ginsburg was an icon possessing a towering intellect who Chief Justice John G. Roberts called "a tireless and resolute champion of justice." 
